Understanding TVET Qualifications Part 2.

There are many opportunities to get TVET certified with TVET CSEC, CVQs, NVQs, diplomas and associate degrees.

What is a CVQ?

A Caribbean Vocational Qualification (CVQ) is a certification system approved by Caricom (with industry specific Qualifications) for individuals who have achieved and demonstrated competence in the essential knowledge, skills and attitudes for an occupation as detailed by the occupational standards for the specific job. CVQs available in Saint Lucia:

- Construction and a number of related areas
- Agriculture and a number of related areas
- Hospitality and business related services
- Occupational Area
- Information communication Technology (ICT) and Related areas
- Allied Health
- Education (Early childhood Education)
- Automotive Motor Vehicle Repair
- Public Services Security Operations
- Providing Security Services
- Creative Industries Steelpan Manufacturing, Tuning and Musical Performance.

What is an NVQ?

National Vocational Qualifications (NVQs) are Vocational Qualifications based on competency standards which have been developed and validated for occupations which are relevant to a particular country. The Saint Lucia National Vocational Qualification (SLNVQ) is an occupational standard developed and validated in Saint Lucia for use in St Lucia and include the following areas:

- Housekeeping room attendant
- Breads, Cakes and Pastry Making Occupational area
- Commercial Food Preparation Commis Chef


